Visitors are welcome to stargaze and learn

about the solar system during assigned nights. (None is offered during the winter, though.) Check the website to register for an Observatory Guest Night beginning in March. Bring a date or go alone to collect some facts to wow your partner the next time you're gazing into the heavens together. Maybe you need a violinist to brush by while you hold your sweetheart's hands and stare awkwardly into her eyes while fumbling for your martini. Or maybe you've dug such a deep hole in the past year you need Old Blue Eyes himself to come by and serenade her with his gushingly romantic "All the Things You Are."

In a county not known for romantic spots, here are three restaurants where you can't go wrong.

Bistro Provence

Where: Bethesda Chef: Yannick Cam

Atmosphere: Southern France

Come for: The Lobster Aumoniere – a thin, almost transparent crepe wrapped around lobster, roasted lightly and served in an emulsion of carrot juice and ginger. Couples can order together and share.

Don't miss: Tartare Salmon spiced with a little sea salt, oil and lemon juice and served with shallots. "It's sushi without the rice, almost sashimi," Cam says.

For something different: At Bistro Provence everything

is something different. "You don't find any of the things at my restaurant at any other French restaurant," Cam says. "I create everything myself based on personal experiences."

The romantic touch: Candles, low lighting and an intimate space create an elegant and romantic atmosphere that looks like the south of France. The kitchen is open to the dining room so it's almost like dining at home with your own personal world-class chef.

Sweets for the sweet: Diners can't go wrong with any of the four chocolate desserts. The cake made with Tanzania chocolate melting in the middle is a chocolate lover's heaven. The four chocolates served with black cherry syrup are rich and gooey and delectable. For the non-chocolate lover (is there such a thing?), try the passion fruit cup.

Where: Bethesda, Silver Spring Chef: Riccardo and Roberto Pietrobono


Atmosphere: Italian

Don't miss: The black iron skillet mussels from Prince Edward Island (Canada) served as an appetizer on a sizzling cast iron skillet.


